## General Hygiene Measures at the University Clinic for Ruminants

## Prevention of zoonoses and spread of infectious diseases

## The following hygiene measures must be observed when dealing with animals as part of the work at the University Clinic for Ruminants:

- Compliance with clothing regulations (stable clothing - coat/shoes)
- Work clothing
- Wear long pants
- Always wear boots and protective clothing (coat) in the stable
- Clean and, if necessary, disinfect boots when leaving the stables
- Take off boots and protective clothing when leaving the stables
- Transport protective clothing and work clothing home well packed (plastic bag) and wash with a suitable programme
- Regular hand washing with soap and water, followed by disinfection
- Regular cleaning of equipment (stethoscope, etc.), after contact with infectious animals also disinfection
- Wearing of disposable gloves, in the event of
- $\quad$ Skin injuries
- Contact with potentially zoonotic/infectious material/animals, e.g.
- Trichophytia
- Calf diarrhea
- Lung diseases
- Secretions and excretions
- Wearing of special protective clothing when examining and treating animals with zoonotic/infectious potential as directed
- No eating/drinking/smoking in the stable
- Taking patients for walks (only if instructed) only in the clinical area within the red floor markings (red line)


## The following hygiene measures must be observed during farm consultancies conducted by the University Clinic for Ruminants:

- Wear clean work clothes
- Disposable overalls as protective clothing
- Clean and disinfect boots and equipment before and after the off-site visit
- Clean and disinfect hands before and after the off-site visit
