Responsibilities

At our busy Small Animal Surgery Unit, you will be trained alongside of four Diplomates ECVS, one senior orthopedic surgeon and two surgical residents. We have a various caseload in soft tissue surgery, orthopedic surgery and neurosurgery. We are a dedicated team looking for a team player with some clinical experience, who maybe had already contact with research. Clinical work includes consulting up to planning surgeries, and, related to experience, performing surgeries under supervision according to the guidelines of the ECVS residency training. In addition, emergency treatments, including out of hours and bank holidays (on call) have to be covered. As a university, all staff members are involved in teaching duties. Within the 3-year training program, publications of two scientific papers, published in ECVS listed journals, are required.
