Minimum salary

The minimum salary for university staff is regulated by the collective contract (Kollektivvertrag) and at the level given above amounts to EUR 2.791,40 gross per month (14x per year on a full-time basis). The salary may be increased, effective payment depending on qualifications and professional experience.
