Veterinary Hospital: The Vetmeduni Vienna campus is located in the heart of Vienna's 21st district, with excellent access to public transportation. All clinics and preclinical institutes, as well as the majority of paraclinical institutes, are situated on the campus grounds, providing an ideal environment for clinical services, teaching, and research.

Centre for Equine Health and Research: The Centre of Equine Health and Research comprises two clinical units, Equine Surgery, and Equine Internal Medicine. Equine reproduction is managed by the Artificial Insemination and Embryo Transfer platform and the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Andrology. There is also close collaboration with clinical departments of Imaging Diagnostics, Anesthesiology, Ophthalmology, the Central Laboratory, and paraclinical institutes.

The hospital is equipped with state-of-the-art medical equipment, including video endoscopy, dynamic endoscopy, ultrasound machines, tele-ECG and activity tracking devices, emergency laboratory, treadmill, digital X-ray technology, CT, MRI, scintigraphy. The Centre of Equine Health and Research has various examination and treatment rooms (surgery/orthopedics, dental treatments, internal medicine, isolation), two operating theaters, one standing surgery suite, 51 stalls (including 5 isolation stalls), and four paddocks. The annual patient case numbers include approximately 700 outpatient cases (around 100 internal medicine cases) and 2,200 inpatient cases (approximately 850 internal medicine cases).

The Centre for Equine Health and Research offers a rotating internship and residency programs for ECVS, ACVS-LA, and ECEIM. The clinical department for Internal Medicine currently has five ECEIM diplomates, two ECEIM residents, two assistant professors, and one postgraduate assistant.

Responsibilities and tasks

- Fulfillment of the tasks of clinical service in the clinical unit of equine internal medicine.
- Involvement in weekend, night, and emergency on-call duties as well as shift work
- Participation in clinical training and courses/classes for students (diploma program in veterinary medicine and doctoral studies), interns and residents
- Research activity can lead to a habilitation
- Emergency work after hours, on holidays, and on weekends is part of the basic duties and will be shared with other senior clinicians
- The appointed candidate will represent the Equine Internal Medicine section through interactions with clients, referring veterinarians, other faculty members and clinicians, colleagues from preclinical and paraclinical institutes, students, external research groups, visitors, and representatives of biomedical companies
- The clinical duties will have to be fulfilled on a weekly basis.

- A professional postgraduate veterinary degree (Dr. med. vet., PhD, or equivalent)
- Training and experience in the field of equine internal medicine equivalent to a completed residency training program (ECEIM or ACVIM-LA)
- Team orientation, adequate clinical experience, excellent communication skills, high motivation for excellent patient care and teaching of students, interns and residents
- Proficient use of English, level (B2)
